

Terms of Service Agreement ArubaSalsa Dance Company

1. When students register at ArubaSalsa, they are aware of, accept, and agree to the Terms of Service of ArubaSalsa Dance Company.
2. For any course or class, a new inscription has to be made and confirmed through e-mail, Whatsapp, or our website.
3. The payment for the course/class has to be fully completed at the first class of said course or class. When allowed to pay in installments, you have to complete the full payment before half of the course, regardless if you decide to finish the course or not. When hindered by vacation, sickness, injuries, relocation, weather, or any other reason, it does not exclude you from paying for the course/class. If you do not complete your payment before the last class, we will charge a 10% fine per month on the open balance until it is fully paid.
4. Always let us know if you're not able to make it to one of your lessons. Contact us at 593-7506 or info@arubasalsa.com.
5. Missed classes cannot be taken to the next season. You should take private lessons to catch up with the group.
6. If you do not participate in more than 50% of the course, you will not graduate and will have to repeat the course. Your instructor decides if you graduate. This is based on your performance during the season and graduation night.
7. When taking private classes, cancellation of a class has to be made at least 48 hours before your scheduled time. When you don't cancel in time, your private class is counted. Private class packages are valid for six (6) months.
8. There are no refunds. All payment is for personal use (unless it's a gift card) and for the course and season, you registered for. The only refund ArubaSalsa gives is if a course/class gets canceled and you pre-paid for it. Classes are not transmissible to other people.
9. If there should be an illness that is preventing you from completing the course, the remaining classes will be continued in the next season. This is only valid after you've indicated it to us with your doctor's letter. Private lessons need to be taken to catch up where you left off.
10. ArubaSalsa is not responsible for any personal injuries or damages should they happen in our classes or events or because of our classes or events. The student is responsible for any damage or injuries caused at ArubaSalsa.
11. Parents are responsible for underage kids dancing at ArubaSalsa and for any damages or injuries caused by their children.
12. ArubaSalsa is not responsible for any students' property during, before, or after one of our classes or events.
13. ArubaSalsa has the right to reject anybody to a course, party, or event without giving a reason.
14. ArubaSalsa has the right to change the classes or course to another day, time or location. This is always communicated and done in case of emergencies.
15. ArubaSalsa has the right to let another instructor rather than the scheduled instructor teach the class. All ArubaSalsa instructors undergo the same intensive training, and a fixed syllabus is used.
16. The assessment of the level of a student will be done by an ArubaSalsa instructor. Private classes should be used to reach the desired level faster.
17. It is not allowed to use any illegal substance, smoke, vape, or drink alcohol excessively on ArubaSalsa property.
18. Please consider your dancing partner(s). Make sure you and your hands are clean and fresh before you start the lesson. We always recommend all our students use a good deodorant, have fresh breath, and bring a towel or an extra shirt for excessive sweating.
19. ArubaSalsa has the right to take pictures or record anyone that is present at their classes, party, or event and is allowed to use this material for its marketing purposes. If you do not wish to be photographed or filmed, please let us know in advance. Material already recorded or published will not be destroyed afterwards.
20. All (future) safety procedures and cleanliness measures to ensure a clean, safe, and disease-free environment must be met by all students (masks, hand sanitation, temperature checks, social distancing, etc.) until this is not required by health officials anymore.
